Frequent Asked Questions and Tips

Bullying and Students' Rights at School

What should a student do if they are being bullied due to their LGBTQ+ identity?

Students & parents should report the bullying to a trusted teacher, school counselor, or administrator. Document the incidents, including dates, times, and descriptions. Schools have a responsibility to provide a safe learning environment and are required by law to take action against bullying.

What can parents do if their child is bullied because they are LGBTQ+?

Parents should communicate with the school to ensure they are aware of the situation and are taking appropriate steps to address it. Request a copy of the school's anti-bullying policy and ask how it is being enforced. WA State's 2019 Legislature passed a law that requires school districts to write a formal harassment, intimidation and bullying (HIB) policies and appoint a HIB Compliance Officer. Make sure to focus on the facts relates to the discrimination and harassment AND let the principal or coordinator know what you want them to do to resolve the problem.

What if a teacher refuses to use a student's correct pronouns?

Students and parents should first attempt to resolve the issue by discussing it directly with the teacher and explaining the importance of using correct pronouns. Pronouns affirm gender identities and create a safe space. In Washington public schools, students have the right to be addressed by their requested pronoun and gender designation.

What are the legal protections for LGBTQ+ students in Washington State?

Washington State has strong anti-discrimination laws that protect students based on sex, sexual orientation and gender identity and gender expression. The Washington State Law Against Discrimination (WLAD) and the Washington State Human Rights Commission enforce these protections. Students and parents can file complaints if their rights are violated.

What response to discriminatory harassment complaints is required by the school?

School staff must investigate possible discriminatory harassment as soon as they know or reasonably should know- even if a parent of student does not file a complaint or ask the school to get involved. This investigation must be thorough, fair and impartial. School staff also need to protect students when necessary, even before the investigation is complete.

The school must:

- 1. Address any effects discriminatory harassment had on the student at school, AND
- 2. Make sure the harassing conduct does not happen again.

Also remember, that the Office for Civil Rights requires that schools must make sure the student who was bullied is helped and not further injured by actions taken in response. OCR says that "any remedy should not burden the student who has been bullied." OCR may be contacted at 1-800-421-3481.

Any questions or complaints of discrimination or harassment based on sex, sexual orientation, or gender expression or identity should be directed towards the district's Civil Rights Compliance Coordinator. What should students and parents do if the school does not address bullying or discrimination?

If the school fails to take action, contact the district's Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) officer and the Civil Rights Compliance Coordinator. Document all communications and responses. If this does not resolve the issue, you can escalate your complaint through the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights at 206-607-1600 or www.ed.gov/ocr, or the WA State Human Rights Commission at 1-800-233-3247 or www.hum.wa.gov, or the U.S. Department of Justice, Educational Opportunities Section at 1-877029203804 or www.justice.gov/crt/about/edu.

You also may consider reaching out to local or national advocacy groups such as the ACLU of Washington, the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, or local organizations like Moms 4 Peace in Gig Harbor. Joining community efforts to voice concerns at school board meetings can also be effective. Legal action can be considered with the help of specialized lawyers who may be referred to as a School Abuse Lawyer.

Discrimination at Work

What constitutes workplace discrimination against LGBTQ+ individuals?

Discrimination can include unfair treatment based on sexual orientation or gender identity, such as harassment, denial of employment opportunities, unequal pay, and wrongful termination. It also includes refusal to use correct names and pronouns or creating a hostile work environment.

Are there legal protections for LGBTQ+ employees in Washington State?

Yes, Washington State's Law Against Discrimination protects all people in WA from unfair and discriminatory practices in employment. Under the law, an employer may not: (1) refuse to hire a person, (2) discharge or bar a person from a job, (3) discriminate in compensation or other terms or conditions or employment, (4) print, circulate, or use any discriminatory statement, advertisement, publication, job application form, or make any inquiry in connection with prospective employment that is discriminatory, because of a persons sexual orientation or gender identity.

Individuals can seek recourse through the Washington State Human Rights Commission at hum.wa.gov/file-complaint or 1-800-233-3247 or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission at 1-800-669-4000 or eeoc.gov.

What steps should someone take if they experience workplace discrimination?

Document the incidents in detail, including dates, times, and descriptions. Report the discrimination to your employer's human resources department or a supervisor. If the issue is not resolved, you can file a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) or the Washington State Human Rights Commission.

What can an employee do if they are being bullied or harassed in the workplace?

If an employee is being bullied or harassed by co-workers, managers, customers or vendors based on their sexual orientation or gender identity, your complaint may still qualify to be investigated by the Washington State Human Right Commission.

What can employees do if their company does not address discrimination complaints?

If the company does not take action, you should reach out to the Washington State Human Rights Commission or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. If the employee is a part of a union, the employee can contact their union advocate for assistance and representation. Organizations like the LGBTQ+ Bar Association or Lambda Legal can provide legal advice and representation.

Discrimination in Public Spaces

What should someone do if they are refused service because they are LGBTQ+?

If you are refused service, document the incident, including the date, time, location, and details of the refusal. Report the incident to the establishment's management. If the issue is not resolved, you can file a complaint with the Washington State Human Rights Commission, as discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity is illegal in public accommodations in Washington State.

What are the legal protections for LGBTQ+ individuals in public spaces in Washington State?

Washington State law protects individuals from discrimination in public accommodations based on sexual orientation and gender identity. The Washington Law Against Discrimination (WLAD) covers places such as hotels, restaurants, and stores. Individuals who face discrimination can file complaints with the Washington State Human Rights Commission.

What steps can be taken if public discrimination complaints are not addressed?

If a complaint is not adequately addressed, individuals can seek help from advocacy organizations such as the ACLU, the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, or local LGBTQ+ centers. Legal assistance can also be sought from lawyers specializing in civil rights and discrimination cases.

Tough Discussion Rules

When engaging in crucial or difficult conversations, it is important to establish some ground rules. But, how do you know it's a crucial conversation?

Does the topic cause emotions? Does your heart race, do you feel warm, hands clammy, or your stomach upset? Those are all signs this is a crucial conversation.

Ground rules:

- Must remain respectful, no interrupting, no insults
- Each individual is given the chance to speak and respond
- Listen to understand understanding is different than agreeing. Avoid making assumptions and ask questions to gain clarity
- Focus on the goal express needs and desired outcome
- · Stay calm and kind

Communication Tips for Parents of LGBTQIA2S+ Youth

Let them know they are loved

"I'm here for you. I love you, and I will support you no matter what."

Thank them for putting trust in you, coming out is a hard thing to do

"Thank you for sharing this part of yourself, I'm glad you felt comfortable enough to do so because I know it can be scary."

"I accept you and love you no matter what."

Encourage dialogue and be curious

Ask questions, be interested in their friends, their interests.

How to get them talking

Bring up their child's friends of characters you encounter while watching age-appropriate movies or TV. For example, if a movie has a bisexual character, spark a conversation by saying "The character in this show is attracted to both boys and girls. That's ok with me. What do you think?"

Coming out as trans, nonbinary, or other transgender identities

"Do you have a name and pronouns you would like me to refer to you by?"

How can you advocate for your child as well as others?

- Advocate for a gay-straight alliance (GSA) has been shown to make schools safer and boost academic performance among LGBTQ students.
- Maintain frequent contact with teachers.
- Push for more inclusive sex education. Very few states allow schools to provide LGBTQ students with the information they need to be safe and health. Be aware of these knowledge gaps so you can fill them yourself.
- Above all, don't hesitate to speak up!

What are some signs of bullying?

- Behavior change (e.g. your outgoing, sociable child is now withdrawn)
- Discipline or behavioral problems in school
- Declining grades

- Unexplained absences
- Sudden shifts in who's a friend and who's not
- Engagement in risky behavior that is out of character

Communication Tips on How to Show Support of the LGBTQIA2S+Community

- **Listen** Listen to their experiences, feelings and concerns without judgment. Let them know they are heard and supported.
- **Respect their identity** Use their chosen gender pronouns and affirm how they choose to live. Misgendering someone can cause harm.
- **Be an ally** Challenge discrimination, misconceptions and stigma. Also be open as a supporter of LGBTQ+ equality.
- **Educate others** Respond when you hear others using non-inclusive language, making derogatory jokes, or using incorrect assumptions. Tell them why you think their comment was inappropriate and how they can improve it.
- **Create a safe space** Foster an atmosphere of acceptance, love and support within your family or social circle. Also take action locally to help create more safe spaces.

You can also consider your own assumptions and biases, and don't ask intrusive questions. If you make a mistake, even an honest one, don't be surprised if it results in an emotional reaction. Apologizing can help de-fuse a difficult situation and re-establish a constructive dialogue.

Responding to Sexism, Homophobia, and Transphobia

- Aren't you trying to change people's beliefs?
 No, we value and respect all people and want them to feel safe.
- Comments regarding clothes, toys, colors, jobs, etc. being gendered.
 There is no such thing "girls' clothes" or "boys' clothes"
 All toys are for everyone
 Clothes are just clothes! They don't have a gender. You can like whatever clothes that you like.
- Someone using "a girl" or "girly" as a taunt or insult.
 All people are equal. Being a girl is not an insult.
 To say, 'you throw like a girl' is to say that girls are not as good at throwing as boys are.
 How well you can run is not based on your gender.
- Disrespectful use of works like Gay and Lesbian
 Gay does not mean bad. If you meant that you don't like something, then say that.

- Homophobic language
 Those words are very hurtful
 Everyone has a right to feel valued and safe
- Equating Gender Identity with Body Parts
 Being a boy/ girl/ or neither comes from your brain/ mind, not from your body parts
 It's none of your business what body parts someone has. That is private and not for others to comment on.
